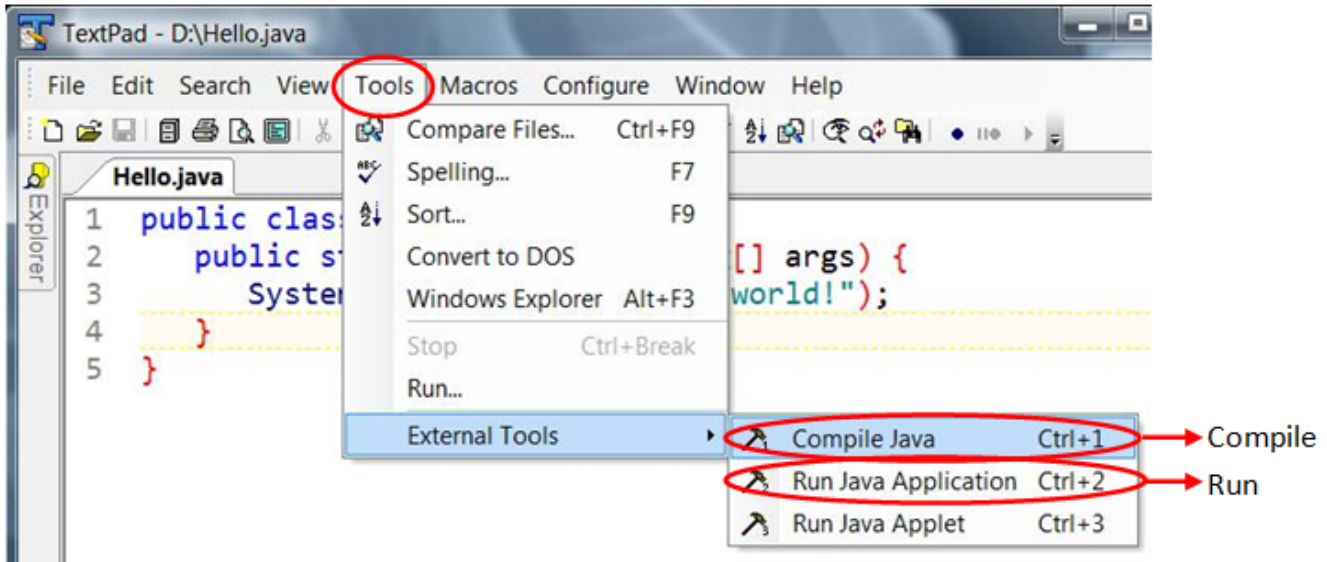

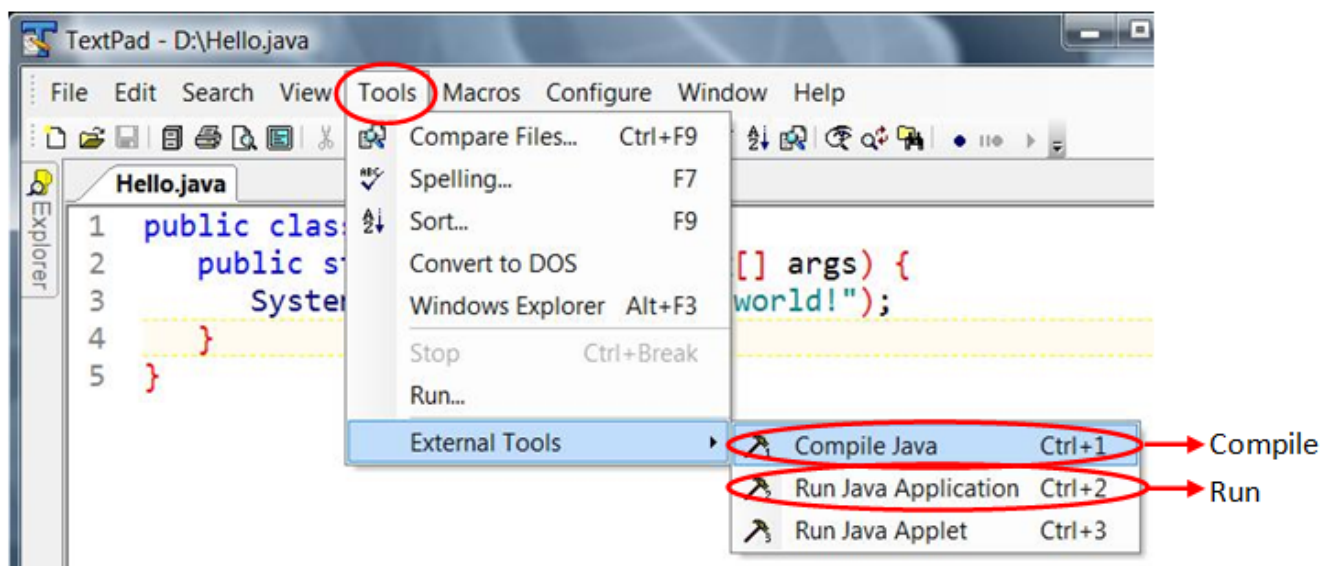

When PowerShell sees a command starting with a string it just evaluates the string, that is, it typically echos it to the screen, for example: PS> 'Hello World' Hello World If you want PowerShell to interpret the string as a command name then use the call operator (&) like so: PS> Internet fax for mac os drivers.

When you invoke an EXE file like this with complex command line arguments it is usually very helpful to have a tool that will show you how PowerShell sends the arguments to the EXE file.. & 'C: Program Files IIS Microsoft Web Deploy msdeploy exe' After that you probably only need to quote parameter/argument pairs that contain spaces and/or quotation chars.. The has such a tool It is called echoargs
